On the following page you will find the template for your five “nominees”, which should be sent to your school contact no less than a month prior to your visit to allow students ample time for research.

The organizations on the template are simply examples for spacing & content. Please adjust the list to reflect your favorite conservation organizations—all five should have 501(c)(3) not-for-profit status. This is your chance to support groups with missions near to your heart. For each, please include the organization’s name and IP address with a brief synopsis, so teachers and students can easily access information. We have provided space to the right of each name in case you are tech savvy and know a way to add the organizations’ icons (optional, of course).

You may also choose to adjust the top paragraph to describe your presentations and/or better share your personal philosophy about conservation. And don’t forget your name and website at the bottom!
